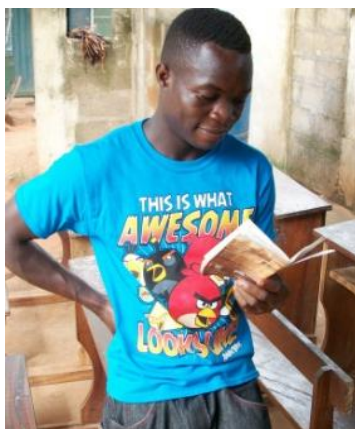


increasingly, the Lord is building that comradery. It is thrilling to see Department Coordinators
